TENNESSEE REGION PORSCHE CLUB OF AMERICA WINTERFEST 2009 February 27 – March 1

We hope you will come be a part of this fun-filled, multi-event weekend at the historic Chattanooga Choo Choo, located near downtown. Competitive events feature Concours d'Elegance, Scenic Poker Run, Tri-cross, and R/C Autocross, all of which will be complimented by good friends, lots of Porsche talk, and fabulous cuisine. This location offers easy access to the world class Tennessee Aquarium, IMAX Theater, Creative Discovery Museum, Bluff View Art District and the fabulous designer shops of the famous Warehouse Row. Chattanooga, on the banks of the majestic Tennessee River, also offers points of interest such as the Incline to Lookout Mountain, Rock City and Ruby Falls.


The Chattanooga Choo / Holiday Inn offers a family friendly environment that includes a heated pool, 4 restaurants and a variety of shops on the premises. The Choo Choo has offered special event rates of \$79 per night. They also offer their special Train Car rooms for \$109 per night (for those who are romantically inclined). Free shuttle transportation is available to the Tennessee Aquarium, as well as a number of downtown attractions.

The registration fee is \$110/car (2 people), or \$80 for a single, **if registered by January 16th**. After January 16th, the cost is \$120/car (2 people) or \$90 for a single. It will cover: a welcoming party with beverages & finger foods/dinner, Concours, a Poker Run, R/C Autocross, Tri-cross, Tech Quiz, Awards Banquet, and Hospitality. Concours classing will be based on the current PCRs. Each class will be judged in two categories; Touring Full and Touring-Lite (Lite means no engine or storage compartments). We hope everyone not being judged will participate in the Concours by showing their cars. We have the use of Grand Central Station, a large heated indoor facility, for Concours preparation, overnight parking and in the event of poor weather conditions, the Concours.

The schedule of events includes the following: Friday – Concours prep, registration, welcome party and Tricross beginning at 8pm down at Grand Central Station. Saturday morning, in conjunction with the Concours, coffee and donuts will be down at Grand Central and the Tech Quiz will be given between 9-10 am. All this will be followed by the Poker Run, RC Autocross and evening banquet. Hospitality will be open most of the weekend at Penn Station, that is also where you can find registration on Friday!



ITS TIME FOR THE ROLEX 24 HOURS AT DAYTONA!!!

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (Jan. 9, 2009) – After eight test sessions earlier this week - seven during the day and one at night - for both classes of the Grand-Am Rolex Sports Car Series presented by Crown Royal Cask No. 16 at Daytona International Speedway, the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup racers and Porsche-powered Riley Daytona Prototypes won more sessions than any other manufacturer. In fact, Porsche teams were fastest in seven of the 16 test contests, with Mazda second (with four fastest times) and Lexus and BMW tied for third with two fastest sessions. In both the Daytona Prototype and GT classes, however, Porsche teams turned the fastest overall times of the weekend.

Darren Law, from Phoenix, Ariz., and Dominik Farnbacher, from Ansbach, Germany waited until the final day to set the fastest laps of the "Roar Before the Rolex 24." Law, driving the No. 58 Brumos Racing Porsche Riley, led the Daytona Prototypes class in the Monday's conclusion of the three-day session with a lap of 1:41.733 (125.977 mph). He will co-drive with David Donohue, Malvern, Penn., Buddy Rice, Phoenix, Ariz., and Antonio Garcia, Madrid, Spain, in the 47th Rolex 24 at Daytona, which takes the green flag at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, January 24. Law also was fastest in the third session on the first day of the test event.

Farnbacher, who has won the Rolex 24 GT class before (2005), waited until the final 30 minutes of the closing session before running a lap of 1:50.881 (115.853 mph) in a simulated qualifying run in the No. 86 Farnbacher Loles Racing Porsche 911 GT3 Cup racer which he will share with Eric Lux, from Jacksonville, Fla., Matthew Marsh, from Hong Kong, and Kevin Roush, of Upland, Calif.

"We've spent a lot of time with this car, and the team has done a good job with setup," Law said. "We've been inching up on it and it's getting there. We're pretty happy with the car. We're close to going racing now. Right now, we're running in race equipment, making sure that everything is working properly. Farnbacher turned the fastest time in the GT class in three of the eight practice sessions over the three-day test on the famous Daytona 3.560 combination oval and road-racing circuit. Farnbacher Loles Racing has five 911s entered in the Rolex 24.

"We had a good performance, and everything worked very well," Farnbacher said. "On our fastest lap, our setup was like what it would be for qualifying, and it worked pretty good. Also, we put new tires on and we wanted to see what the difference would be between old and new tires. It was not really a big gain. The Pirelli tires are very good and very consistent. I also did a long run to see how the tires would perform through the stint, and the Pirelli tires were very consistent. We are quite happy to have such good lap times."

Club Racing Update

The Racer's Edge/European Auto Garage race team had a busy and successful race season.

St. Simons Island, GA resident Dr. Chris Dooley took a 2nd place finish in the Sprint race at the Sebring Club Race in February along with a 3rd place finish in the Enduro. Dooley followed up with a 3rd place finish in the sprint race at Road Atlanta along with a 2nd place finish in the Enduro.

20 year-old Auburn student and Nashville resident Jade Buford raced in four events with the Racer's Edge/EAG team. Highlights of his race season included a top five finish at Road Atlanta driving the Racer's Edge prepared I-stock 996. He followed up with a 3rd place finish at Barber Motor Sports Park driving the Racer's Edge E-Stock 944 S2. Capping off a succesful PCA rookie season was taking three class wins racing the 944 S2 at VIR and also winning the Corner Worker's Award.

Buford used the PCA season as a springboard to race Koni Challenge in 2009. He will co-drive a Mini Cooper in the ST class with Owen Trinkler. Trinkler is a Master Porsche Driving Instructor, Grand Am Pro and also assists the Racer's Edge Motorsport Program.

David Hinkle, co-owner of European Auto Garage long with Karl Poeltl, took a 4th place finish in the enduro at Road Atlanta in his 993 RS. After an engine rebuild by the techs at EAG, he had two 2nd place finishes at Barber Motor Sport Park in Arpil.

Karl Poeltl, owner of Racer's Edge and partner's with Hinkle at EAG made his long-awaited debut with his I-stock 996. He tested the car during practice at Road Atlanta and ran a 1:36:2, breaking Hinkle's class record. At the Barber event, Poeltl took wins in the sprint and enduro races. He again broke Hinkle's class record by running a 1:39:4. Poeltl finished his PCA season at Roebling with two class wins and a new track record of 1:17:3 and was awarded the Corner Worker's Award.
