2009 Smoky Moutain PCA / European Auto Garage Autocross Series...

Came to an end with the final event for the combined series taking place in October. There were 5 combined events, and 2 additional Porsche only events for 2009. Spring Thing and Fall Fest were the two Porsche only events, with their own seperate awards. Thanks go to all those that helped make the series a success, and particularly to European Auto garage for their support.

The Porsche event was a close run event, with Rick Brooksbank taking the honors, with Bonne Foulds first in the women's competition.

The European Challenge was also a close event, with the points leader seemingly changing every other event. The Trophy though goes to Scott Gibson in his BMW Mini Cooper S in first with 44 points, Bradley Allen was second in his Lotus Elise with 26 points, with William Davis a close third in his BMW 325ix with 24 points.

In the non-Euro event John Brown takes the Trophy in his STS Mazda Miata with a total of 38 points. Second with 20 points was Stuart Gibson in a Mustang GT and third place honors go to Shawn Gebbia with 16 points in the Subaru STi.

This year saw a marked increase in overall attendance, both from Porsche and non-Porsche entries - a trend we would like to see continue!

For 2010, we have embarked on an ambitious schedule to include 8 autocross events, 2 autocross driving schools, and 2 track days.

Be sure to join us for the first autocross school to be held at Pellissippi State Community College Parking lot on 3/27/10. Spaces are limited, and we are taking reservations NOW. Email your reservation to jonathanfoulds@yahoo.com.

The autocross school will be a whole day of one-on one instruction, so space will be limited to the first 20 entries. Cost will be \$45.00 per person, and will include lunch and refreshments. A hint, attending the school will probably help you if you intend running the first PCA autocross the next dat on 3/28/10, so book early!



We hope you will come be a part of this annual fun-filled, multi-event weekend at the historic Chattanooga Choo Choo, located near downtown. Competitive events feature Concours d'Elegance, Poker Rally, Tri-cross, and R/C Autocross, all of which will be complimented by good friends, lots of Porsche talk, and fabulous cuisine. This location offers easy access to the world class Tennessee Aquarium, IMAX Theater, Creative Discovery Museum, Bluff View Art District and the fabulous designer shops of the famous Warehouse Row. Chattanooga, on the banks of the majestic Tennessee River, also offers points of interest such as the Incline to Lookout Mountain, Rock City and Ruby Falls.

The Chattanooga Choo Choo / Holiday Inn offers a family friendly environment that includes a heated pool, 4 restaurants and a variety of shops on the premises. The Choo Choo has offered special event rates of \$83 per night. They also offer their special Train Car rooms for \$139 per night (for those who are romantically inclined). Free shuttle transportation is available to the Tennessee Aquarium, as well as a number of downtown attractions.

The registration fee is \$110/car (2 people), or \$80 for a single, if register by January 22nd. After January 22nd, the cost is \$120/car (2 people) or \$90 for a single. It will cover: a welcoming party with beverages & finger foods/dinner, Concours, a Poker Run, R/C Autocross, Tri-cross, Tech Quiz, Awards Banquet, and Hospitality. Concours classing will be based on the current PCRs. Each class will be judged in two categories; Touring Full and Touring-Lite (Lite means no engine or storage compartments). We hope everyone not being judged will participate in the Concours by showing their cars. We have the use of Grand Central Station, a large heated indoor facility, for Concours preparation, overnight parking and in the event of poor weather conditions, the Concours.

The schedule of events includes the following: Friday – Concours prep, registration, welcome party and Tricross beginning at 8pm down at Grand Central Station. Saturday morning, in conjunction with the Concours, coffee and donuts will be down at Grand Central and the Tech Quiz will be given between 9-10 am. All this will be followed by the Rally, RC Autocross and evening banquet. Hospitality will be open most of the weekend at Penn Station, that is also where you can find registration on Friday!

Autocross, fun in second gear

We have the cars, why not drive them, push them, and **learn** how to be a much better Porsche driver? Autocross is your chance to learn to be as good a driver you always thought you were, and never getting out of second gear. Most people think you have to own a racecar and be some sort of race driver to be an autocrosser. That is just not so.

You do not even need a helmet to start autocrossing. The Smoky Mountain Region will provide "loaner" helmets. Beyond that, all you need is an automobile (we assume that will be a Porsche if you are reading this). Do not worry that you do not know one thing about the sport; the chairman will provide you with an instructor for as long as you think you need one. Personally, I will be at most autocrosses and will be glad to be instructor or advisor for anyone who wants to learn and feel more comfortable.

Before you arrive make sure your battery is secure, tires are inflated to about 5-6 pounds over the recommended pressure, all loose objects are out of the car (floor mats included), brakes are solid, no serious fluid leaks, and lug nuts are tightened to about 95 pounds. We will take care of the lug nuts if you do not have the proper wrench.

Show up and introduce yourself as a novice to Jonathan Foulds and ask for an instructor. They're several members qualified and willing to help you.
