# Randy Pobst At Knoxville Performance By Tommy Wilson

"My favorite Porsche is the 993. It is a great car and when you put a turbo on it you can go from the street to the race track." "My favorite track is VIR. It is a great track."

That was a couple of the responses to the many questions asked of Randy Pobst as he met with members of the Smoky Mountain Region at Knoxville performance Center on Monday, August 16. Pobst was the guest of, friend, Michael Grande, owner of Knoxville Performance Center. Grande's performance center maintains Pobst's personal 996 turbo.

Grande prepares a variety of Porsche race cars for the different race series around the country as well as racing his own Porsche. Grande's friendship with Pobst started at the race tracks and grew into Pobst driving one of Grande's Porsches for a while. "in fact, said Grande, Randy set a lap record at Lime Rock a few years ago in one of my cars."

Pobst is the 2<sup>nd</sup> in wins among all active road race drivers. He has won the Daytona 24 hour twice, in 2001 and 2006.

Pobst's friendly style kept the interest of the SMTR members as he told story after story of his experiences and evaluation of different race cars. Currently he is racing the K-Pax Volvo S60 with Andy Pilgrim in the World Challenge Series. The Volvo was a car which took a lot of work to make it a winner, said Pobst. That included the addition of a giant turbo. The 2.5 liter engine generates 500 hp with 26 lbs of boost.

He shared with the group that the series is constantly making adjustments to teams and cars if they are "too successful" by doing things like adding 200-250 pounds of lead to the cars, just to slow them down. He had that experience racing Porsches.

Pobst mentioned in a recent road test of the Audi R8, Jaguar XKF and the Porsche Caymen S, the Caymen was declared to be the best of the lot. He added, "with the PDK transmission, it is the perfect car. In fact it is almost boring to drive because it takes so little skill to drive at speed." He finished that comment by saying the manual transmission with become a thing of the past and noted several cars with similar transmissions to the Porsche PDK.

#### CHANGES TO THE TALLEDEGA EVENT

The Driver's Ed, scheduled for October 2-3, is open as a two-day event but only the second day is a The Smoky Mountain Region's PCA sanctioned event, explains Jonathan Foulds, event chair.

Foulds said the region did not have enough pre-registrations to justify the expense of a two-day event and had to request the track owners limit it to Sunday only. The owners offer the option of them sponsoring the Saturday session but it could not be a PCA sanctioned event.

Foulds reports the fee for the two-day event (\$315) will be the same but those who want to do Sunday only will pay \$195. He added they have had to eliminate the tee shirt, originally advertised.

Instructors will be required to pay \$150 for the Saturday session.

So, bottom line is: the DE is still a two-day event. The fee is the same but the second day is the only day sanctioned by the Smoky Mountain Region PCA.

#### Needs For Driver's Ed -- A Short List

The needs list for participating in a driver's education (DE) event is a fairly short list when it comes to having you and your car ready to go. Many think they have to have their car race prepared but nothing could be further from the truth. Basically, your car has to be safe for the highway and interstate speeds.

Yes, you are going to be driving faster than you normally would on a road with some curves on it, and there will be others cars in your general vicinity, but never fear it will be fine. Those with little or no track experience will have instructors (not optional). Those instructors are going to show the drivers the best way around the track, known as "the line." That will be the fastest and the safest way around the track. There will be assigned passing zones which will probably be the three straight sections of the track. No one passes another car without getting a signal from the car in front, which is another safety factor. As for the car's check list, there are several things you will need to look over before you leave home.

- 1. Tires must have ample tread on them. They do not have to be new but they cannot be in question as far as it being time to replace them.
- 2. Tire pressure is important. Make sure you have a tire pressure gauge and your pressures are about five pounds above the recommended street pressure. You can always let air out but do not count on an air compressor on site.
- 3. Make sure your lugs are properly torqued at 90-95 pounds. We can do that for you if you do not have the proper equipment.
- 4. There should be a check of all fluids, making sure they are all topped off and there are NO leaks.
- 5. Make sure your battery is secure and tight.
- 6. All belts must be in good condition.
- 7. All loose items must be out of the car while on the track and that includes floor mats. I usually leave the mats at home so I do have to keep up with them. You might bring some sort of bag to put those things in.
- 8. A clean windshield is helpful
- 9. Brakes MUST be in good shape and pads are not worn enough to weaken your stopping power.
