SPRING THING 2011

Spring Thing, April 15-17, is just around the corner! This years' event will have a few changes from previous years. One...a different venue. Two...a committee has been put together for the events organization, rather than having an event chair.

Spring Thing is one of the longest running multi-event weekends in PCA. Heading toward its fortieth anniversary in a few years! The event has been in various locations every couple of years to give the membership an opportunity to see different parts of our Region. Oak Ridge was the event location last year but the host hotel could not be secured for a follow-up visit. A decision was made to return to the tourist cities of Pigeon Forge and Gatlinburg since many successful Spring Things were held in that region years ago. The theme this year will be: Come early, shop—clean your car-shop-show your car —rallye — shop -dine, then autocross, shop again, and go home!

Suzan Bowman secured a great lodging venue, the Music Road Inn, in Pigeon Forge (www.musicroadhotel.com). The hotel is just off the main highway running through Pigeon Forge, close to shopping venues, immediate to roadways and away from the city for the rallye portion of he event. Rooms are being held for us, at the contracted rate of \$99, until March 15th. Make sure you get your reservation in (ph. 800.429.7700).

As of this writing, the concours will be held on the hotel grounds, Saturday morning. It will be a top only affair, with the vehicles under carriage not being judged. Cars are not judged on originality, but on the vehicles overall cleanliness. There will be multiple classes, grouping similar cars together. Peoples Choice and Judges Choice awards will also be decided here.

Our TSD Rallye will start at the hotel, Saturday afternoon. Roads in the immediate area are free of hotels, shops, etc., and should be quite a pleasure to navigate, with many nice vistas that the Smoky Mountains offer. Although, a TSD Rallye, our Regions' rallies are designed for the fun of the rallye team, and to encourage the team to try rallying again in the future. Our Saturday evening banquet will be in a facility across from the Inn. It will provide you an opportunity to meet with, and bond with other PCA members, not only from our Region, but the Regions that surround ours. It is an awards ceremony also winners in both the Concours and Rallye will be announced. A nice end to a busy day!

Sunday mid-morning you're invited to participate in our Spring Thing autocross. We have secured the fourteen acre Splash Country site, that we successfully introduced at Fall Fest 2010. It is a huge site, making for a great autocross, and is only minutes from the Inn. A great opportunity for both novices and old timers to 'show their stuff'. Awards will be presented on site. 
Sorry 'Bout That
