Eighteen PCA'ers showed up at the Black Oak Marina Restaurant for a mid morning breakfast. Rick Berry's presentation began with an overview of the bearing, possibilities of failure and recommended solutions.

Attention was then directed toward a 996 engine out of the car and the bearing was removed during the tech session.







# The Ride of My Life

As my father said in the last issue of Smoke Signals in the article "My First Time on the Autobahn"... Car guy nirvana. When we looked online before we left, there were many different options to go with around the Nurburgring. There is the tourist drive (driving your own car around), the Rental car drive (you rent from a variety of hot hatchbacks and drive those around), or there is the 'Ring Taxi (have a professional driver drive you around in a supercar: BMW M5, Aston Martin, 911 GT3, and a 911 Turbo S to name a few). But first, my mom's coworker's son, Andy, who is about 20-21 years old.

Andy has a slightly modified Golf GTI. Shelby volunteered to ride with him on his warm up lap, turning a 9:20.

Next was me. I got in, buckled my seatbelt and prepared myself for awesomeness. He put his phone into a holder and videoed the whole thing. It also acted as a timer, G-force meter, a speedo, and a track based map to find yourself on the track.

Not thinking clearly, I had asked Andy what was probably the stupidest thing I could have said, "Is the speedometer in miles or kilometers?" Idiot. Knowing me, that is the loudest thing I had said the entire time.

The video is on Youtube (I'll link it at the end of this story). He also had a GoPro recording both his face and my face. That video, however, is not on Youtube just yet.

We set off. He has a perfect driving technique: good shifts and incredible heel-and-toe downshifting as well, good lines through all corners, and all while being very smooth. We came up on a 997 Turbo S, passed it, and left it behind for the rest of the lap.

When you watch the video, you do not realize just how much elevation change there is (300 meters or about 1000 feet). There are 73 corners: 33 lefts and 40 rights. If you are a fan of the track, you might be familiar with a turn called the Carousel. Andy actually has to turn off the



traction control for this corner because the car will think he is out of control. You will understand when you see the video.

About one-third through the lap we came upon a Mitsubishi Evo VI. We lost it solely due to our lack of power. But, about two-thirds through, we saw it again. I told Andy to try to catch up with it. He was already thinking the same thing. There was almost no traffic that got in our way.

The lap was over before I knew it. That lap was not only Andy's best of the day, but it was also his best lap ever, an 8:59. When I got back, it was my dad's turn. He only did a 9:08, still very fast.

That was, however, not my favorite part of the day. My parents agreed to get me a ride with a pro driver for my 18th birthday (Feb. 7). I picked, of course, the brand new 991 GT3. My driver was named Theo. He has driven for many years around the track. When I asked him exactly how much experience he had, he told me, "I have much more than 10,000 laps here."

It was illegal to video tape that lap, but there is one on Youtube with Theo driving, but a different passenger. I will link that video as well. Again, not much traffic to worry about, but every car that we did stumble upon, we passed immediately. Around the carousel, where Andy was going 40-50 KPH, Theo went around at 90-100 KPH. I will NEVER get tired of that engine revving to 9,000 directly behind my head.

I said the same thing as all the reviewers. That last 500 rpm makes all the difference. Theo estimated our lap time as about a 7:30 (times are not comparable to the record due to the different route that they take to set the record).

The weather could not have been any better for the lap. It actually stormed the night before, which made me worried that they were not going to want to drive on a wet track. They actually closed off the track the entire morning due to the rain and even snow in some areas. It cleared up

around noon, just in time for our arrival.

Every time someone does something for you, including the lap, they always say, "It was good for you?" Yeah it was good for me, are you kidding!

That was the ride of my life!
