PARTING SHOTS

The Revs Institute in Naples, Florida, presents the Miles Collier Collections of over one hundred significant automobiles built between 1896 and 1995. The automobiles on display at Revs are some of the rarest and most important cars ever built at anytime, anywhere. And the vast majority of the cars still run!!

For example, this 1953 Porsche 550 Coupe.



The 1953 Porsche 550 Coupe (550-01) is in the Revs shop recently. 550-01 first raced at Le Mans in 1953 with Hans Herrmann and Helm Glöckler at the wheel and finished second in class just behind the sister car 550-02. Both cars would go on to compete in various races including the Carrera Panamericana (550-02 won) and the 1000-Kilometer race in Buenos Aires (550-01 won). The 550 was Porsche's first car designed from the ground up to be a racing car and it was just the start of the Porsche's involvement in motorsports.
