HPDE – It's not just a funny chemical name

Otherwise known as "High Performance Drivers Education", the PCA Drivers Education (DE) Program provides a safe, structured, and controlled teaching and learning environment. It is designed to let participants improve their driving abilities and acquire a better understanding of vehicle dynamics and driving safety. Participants will experience first-hand the capabilities of high-performance automobiles in a controlled, closed-course environment and acquire skills that will enhance safer vehicle operation in all driving situations. DEs are normally 1-3 day events at some iconic track nearby: Barber, Road Atlanta, VIR, AMP, etc. Drivers are grouped into up to five run groups based on experience and ability: Novice, Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced and Instructor. Novices have an instructor assigned to them, someone who knows the track and hopefully in a car like yours.

Smoky Mountain has a group that DEs regularly, and some adjacent regions sponsor some safe and exciting events. The Calendars have just been released so give it some thought!

With all this wintery weather we've been having, and that many have "put their babies away" for the winter, one intrepid Porschephile wondered "How do they do in the winter?" Excluding the all-wheel drive SUVs, Porsches are not generally thought of as cold weather capable. Or are they...

Off to Finland it is then!
