

#### **PARTING SHOT – Fun at the Porsche Track Experience, Barber Motorsports Park**

The <u>Porsche Track Experience</u> (PTX) is the official US driving school of Porsche, and is a learning by doing and skills practicing program, located within the <u>Barber Motorsports Park</u> in Birmingham, AL. From the basics of vehicle control to applying for a racing license, they can provide all the training. The track at Barber Motorsports Park is a true racing circuit, a 2.38 mile, 16 turn course that features a wide variety of challenging turns and elevation changes. In addition, there are offroad courses, autocross tracks, slick tracks, all manner of venues to learn car control and racing skills.

The PTX operates the school over 160 days a year at Barber, and twice a year they host Porsche Dealership guests for a day of skills practice in many venues and many different Porsches. Track laps, ride along hot laps, skid pad, at speed lane changes, autocross, offroad, and a complimentary chiropractic adjustment (ride along Launch Control pass in a Turbo 4S). This is a customer "thank you" from the dealers, and "sampler platter" promotion for the PTX. This month Harper Porsche took a few PCA member customers along and showed them a good time at Barber! Thank you, Harper Porsche!



We even got a brief tour of the Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum, and we only got a "talking to" twice!
