The People's Choice award went to Lee and Suzanne Fowler in their 1965 356C and the Judges Choice went to Allan and Rose Cox's 1979 911 SC.

Lunch at the Museum: Then it was off to lunch at the City Garage Car Museum. Bettey Ann and Ken Bewely welcomed the club with open arms to view the new acquisitions to the museum and have lunch in their 1950's Diner. The table decorations were handmade with our logo and in the German colors. They also came up with a trivia game at the tables on the history of Porsche. We visited the Museum in 2015 and they have added about 6 new automobiles that did not disappoint!

The Holston United Methodist Home for Children in Greeneville has a catering arm that teaches the children who live there to cook and cater food. We bought our delicious buffet lunch from them.

Rallies: After lunch, the two Rally Meister's rounded up the cars and set out on two different drives on the beautiful roads in Greene County. Matt & Teresa Fischer designed a mountainous tour called the Gimmick Rally. Ask someone on the Gimmick Rally about "The Gimmick".

Autocross: The General Morgan Inn provided a complementary "on the go" breakfast items on Sunday morning as at least half of the group headed out for the Greeneville Airport.
