PERFORMANCE DRIVING

Well, the **autocross** season is well under way! So far there have been 4 SCCA events and the Porsche mark was well represented. Some of the participants include: Jamie Parton, Todd Sutton, Dave Yoder, Bo Whaley, Carl Justice and Russ Johnson (Wilderness Trail), David Vetter (Appalachian Region), and John McDermott. There are 5 more SCCA events scheduled for this year. If you're interested in learning more, ask one of the people mentioned or check out the website: www.etrscca.org. We hope you'll come out and give it a try!

As previously mentioned, our club has 3 of our own autocross events scheduled. The dates are listed elsewhere and more information will be forthcoming.

Ever wonder what it's like to drive your car on a racetrack? High Performance Driving Education (HPDEs) are scheduled all during the year at various tracks. Many of the tracks have professional races held at them such as Watkins Glen, Barber, and VIR. Depending upon your experience, those new to the sport or with limited experience would be assigned an instructor. The instructors work with you to build your capability in driving on a track, learning the correct drive line, appropriate braking point and passing. Some events have a DEX group. This group drives at road speeds on the track with an instructor in the car. They typically are only one day and about a \$100 fee.

So far this year, we have had 12 people (club members and a few of their sons), participate in HPDEs. The season kicked off late April with Jamie Parton, Carl Justice, Rick Berry, Matt Fischer and John McDermott driving at Virginia International Raceway (VIR), sponsored by the First Settlers Region. It is a 3.5-mile track with long straights.



The second event over Memorial Day weekend, Jamie Parton, Todd Sutton and Carl Justice ran at National Corvette Museum Motorsports Park. This event was put on by 10-10ths, an organization that runs HPDEs at different tracks across the country. This track is approximately 2.9 miles long with over 20 turns!
