PARTING SHOT – And Now for Something Completely Different

Something a little different this time, as last month Debi and I met some of my model car friends in Auburn, Indiana, some Chicago model car meets. We toured the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Museum (A-C-D), and on the same property is the National Auto and Truck Museum (NATMUS). The A-C-D museum is housed in the original office and showroom of Everett Loban Cord's factory, and the building itself is chock full of art deco design elements.

Here are some pics from those tours, and they are some classics. The black 1921 Duesenberg Model A is the very first Duesey road car, originally delivered to Hawaii, and stayed in the owner's family for 99 years before donation to the museum. It is car #27 in the National Historic Vehicle Register run by the US Dept. of the Interior: not many cars get this designation. The Cord L-29 was America's first production FWD car, and the Cord 810 was designer Gordon Buehrig's personal car.
